

HOMEWORK PACKET 2021

FOR STUDENTS AGES 13-18

2021 S.T.U.F.F. HOMEWORK

Students should bring two copies of their completed homework: one to turn in and one to reference throughout the week. Completing the following homework and fully participating during the week is roughly equivalent to .25 high school credit in government. They should bring three copies of their bill.

- 1. Memorize Isaiah 33:22 using the Bible translation of your choice
- 2. Research the definitions for the words from Pre-Class Vocabulary (page 4).
- **3. Fill out the State Political Fact Sheet.** Two sources that you can use are the official New Mexico website (<u>newmexico.gov</u>) and the Project Vote Smart website (<u>votesmart.org</u>) which has information on elected officials.
- 4. Send a letter to your New Mexico state Senator and New Mexico state Representative. Thank them for their service and ask a couple of thoughtful questions about legislation they are sponsoring or current topics you think are especially important.
- 5. Write a one-page bill on an issue important to you and relevant to New Mexico. Use the format provided in this homework packet. Bring 3 copies.

OPTIONAL HOMEWORK

Option 1 will allow students to more fully develop their leadership skills and knowledge of government by participating in elections during the week. Options 2 & 3 provide a deeper understanding of government and is one way to earn additional credit toward high school government.

1. Campaign Preparation

- a. You have the option to run for senator or governor.
- b. Components of a campaign
 - i. Create a slogan
 - ii. Prepare a short speech
 - iii. Prepare supplies such as signs or pins
 - iv. Do some research on campaigning to prepare.

3. Write an Essay on why freedom of speech is an essential part of a free society.

Essays will be read and evaluated by adult reviewers to give your student objective feedback on their thinking and writing.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

SECTION 1. [NEW MATERIAL] SHORT TITLE.--This act may be cited as the "Healthy Workplaces Act".

SECTION 2. [NEW MATERIAL] PURPOSE OF ACT.--The purposes of the Healthy Workplaces Act are to:

A. regulate employee benefits regarding earned sick

leave within New Mexico;

B. ensure that all employees in New Mexico can address their own health and safety needs and the health and safety needs of their families by requiring employers to

provide a minimum amount of earned sick leave, including leave

SECTION 3. [NEW MATERIAL] DEFINITIONS – As used in the Healthy Workplaces Act:

- A. "earned sick leave" means time that is compensated at the same hourly rate and with the same benefits,...
- B. "employ" means suffer or permit to work;
